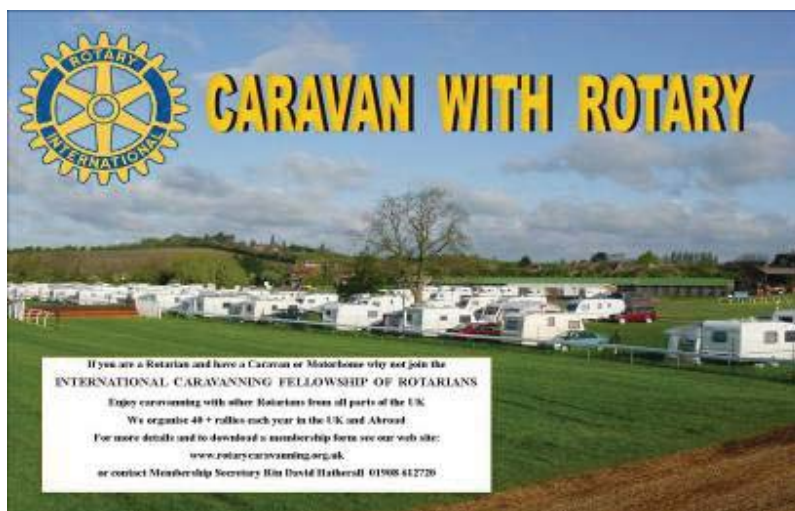
International Caravanning Fellowship of Rotarians

Fourteen teams participated, seven from India, two from Australia, one each from Great Britain & Ireland, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and South Africa as well as a combined team which included players from New Zealand and Nigeria.

Accommodation for all teams was at Blue Waters Hotel on the Durban beachfront, resulting in fantastic interaction between Rotarians from different countries and cultures.

Convener of the Festival was PDG Gerald Sieberhagan, assisted by PDG Gordon Dowsett and a very hard working committee. All are to be congratulated for the work they put in.

Festival functions raised funds for various South African Rotary projects and former South African cricketers Pat Symcox and Errol Stewart were interesting guest speakers.

The IFRC AGM was also held and long standing world Chairman Michael Jackson from England stood down after thirteen years involvement at IFRC executive level. Michael's efforts to promote and encourage IFRC are applauded by all members.

New world IFRC Chairman is PDG David Horsley and new Secretary Graeme Amoore, both from Australia. V (Kittu) Krishnaswami from India was elected Vice President.

The AGM decided the 7th World Festival of Rotary Cricket will be held in Vapi, Gujarat, India D 3060 February 19 – 25, 2012. The Rotary Club of Vapi has an enviable record of rural development, healthcare and education projects since chartering in 1971 and is the home Club of world RI President 2011-2012 RIPN Kalyan Banerjee. Not only will IFRC be able to celebrate the anniversary of RI on February 23 during the Festival, but will celebrate being hosted by the Home Club of the world RI President in his year of office. IFRC looks forward to seeing all members in Vapi in 2012.

Buenos Aires Great Encounter of the "Latin Rotarians"– September 12th ,2009

Someone once said that if you ever attend one of these meetings, you will never leave Rotary. And this is probably true. Almost a hundred attendants enjoyed the camaraderie of Rotarians and friends, tasting the excellent "asado" (Argentine barbecue) cleverly supervised by our "Master Barbecue Officer" Omar Campos.

Lots of miles were covered to be present in Buenos Aires on that Saturday evening. Our President, Marcos Cabrera, travelled all the way down from Tenerife, Canary Island, Spain, with his wife Merci; Alfonso Ayala, one of the coordinators of our translation department, kindly surprised us travelling from Belize in Central America; a large Uruguayan delegation brought the famous Tannat wine from their country, which hit the record at the auction held that night; and from Argentina we had friends coming from far North (Tucumán) and far South, Ushuaia and Bariloche (Patagonia), from the center (Córdoba and Santa Fe) and Buenos Aires (Mar del Plata, Tandil, Olavarría, Villa Gesell). More than twenty Rotary Clubs were represented.

An informal and emotional changeover was held between Past President Marcelo Frangiosa and Present President Marcos Cabrera. As there were several members of the board present, they were introduced to the audience.

To entertain our guests we had a Queimada (a Celtic Ceremony), a tradition at our meetings always done by PGD Juanjo Vidal Mauriz, and a magician, whose performance was absolutely amazing.

But our encounter was much more than a mere opportunity to meet in person and hug that fellow we know quite well but have never seen before, the chance of meeting people from other countries or from distant places from our own country. Our encounter fostered our "serving above self" ideal, with the help of all attendants we managed to raise a significant amount of money which was donated to the Orthopedic Element Bank in Buenos Aires, where the meeting was held in order to help by renting the hall for the evening.

The organizing committee, formed by three ladies: Elisa Oviedo, Lidia Gogorza and myself, worked a lot but was very happy with the outcome after so much effort.

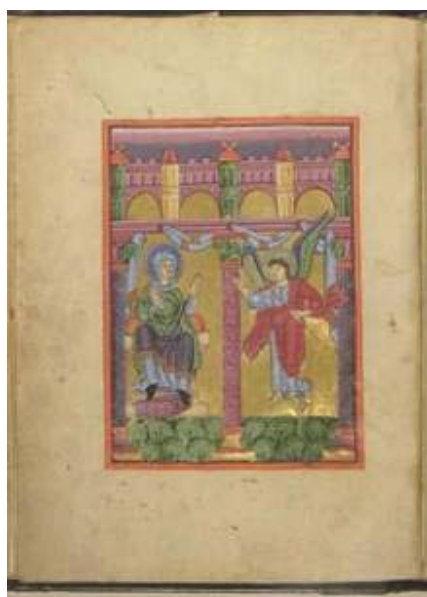

It is an illuminated codex, realized in the Benedictine Abbey of Reichenau Island on lake Constance in Germany between the end of the 10th and the beginning of the 11th century. All the manuscript illuminations are available in high resolution digital format only on official site of Rotary Fellowship “Old And Rare Antique Books And Prints”, aimed at preserving and conserving the book heritage of humanity. 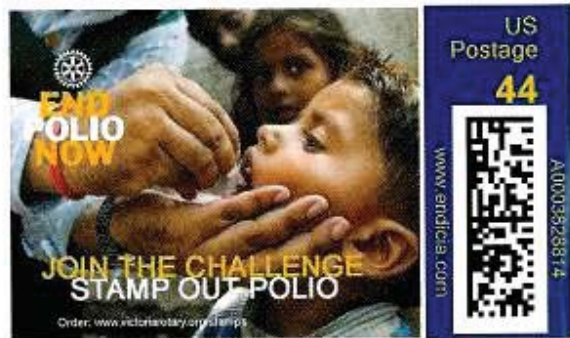
