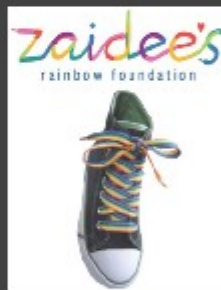

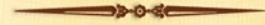
Many clubs have shown an interest in forming an Interact Club and coordinator Ron Howard has handed out many DVD's and answered many questions.

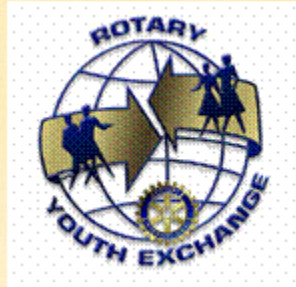
